A WORD FROM PT

Two Sundays ago, I asked the gathered congregation three rhetorical questions before the start of the Divine Service. I asked that the questions be carefully listened to and pondered. I will repeat them in this column also, and I ask that you contemplate them.

The first question was this:
Do you believe that the
Bible is the Word of God,
that it is God's voice speaking to us? Most of us will
quickly answer this in the
affirmative. After all, we
belong to a communion and
confession of faith that believes this to be true. But do
we really sense the gravity
in this belief?

The second question was: Believing that Scripture is the Word of God, His voice speaking to us, do we recognize that this voice amidst the cacophony of the myriads of voices clamoring for our attention is more important than all the rest?

And the third and final question I posed was: Are you listening and meditating on this voice each and every day, and throughout the day?

Baptized believers are people of the Word! Did you know there is regrettably such a thing as 'baptized unbelievers'? Baptized believers learn to delight in God's Word, and in the words of the Psalmist "on His law [they] meditate day and night" (Ps 1:2). They in the words of Joshua 1:8:

"meditate on it day and night, so that [they] may be careful to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success."

In New Testament terms we are to "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God" (Co 3:16).

The voice we give priority to will eventually form us. It will fill our hearts and overflow from our lips. An effective witness will be dependent on our being held captive to the Word of God.

Why do we celebrate Holy Communion nearly every Sunday?

The celebration of the meal we call Holy Communion has consistently been the chief act of Christian worship since the age of the Apostles. The Lutheran Reformation did not break with this tradition of 1,500 years. In fact the Augsburg Confession (our principal statement of faith) declares Holy Communion to be the chief act of worship for Lutherans on Sundays and festivals (Art. 26). *(from "Manual on the Liturgy" companion to the LBW,*

from Augsburg Pub.)

You might think of Holy Communion as spiritual bread and drink for our journey (pilgrimage), for our Lord's Body and Blood is true nutrition indeed!
