Do Lutherans Promote Private Confession?

"Confession has not been abolished by the preachers on our side. ... The people are carefully instructed concerning the consolation of the Word of absolution (forgiveness) so that they may esteem it as a great and precious thing. It is not the voice of the man who speaks it, but it is the Word of God, who forgives sin, for it is spoken in God's stead and by God's command. . . . it is necessary for terrified consciences" (Augsburg Confession, XXV).

Private confession has two parts: First that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the Pastor as from God himself.

ADDRESS FROM CONGREGATION PRESIDENT...

UPDATE from the church COUNCIL

It has been a couple of months since we made the decision not to pursue purchasing property at this time, and we wanted you to know what has been happening since then.

We reached out to the 'large church' LCMS for guidance. As a result we have decided to go through a process called the <u>Congregational Compass</u>.

This will include 3 parts:

1st: the collecting of demographics regarding 'our neighbors' – the people living between here and Trempealeau and here and Galesville. (update...We

already have this data thanks to the work of the school committee, and are beginning to review it.)

2nd: an internal assessment – an on-line survey- consisting of 95 questions designed to objectively answer the question "where are we... really?". All members and anyone else involved with our church will be asked to complete this. We have decided to do this in November, and more will be shared about this as the date gets nearer.

3rd: The WHY Discovery process – where a facilitator will come to our church on a Saturday morning to meet with all of us together – not just the council – for a 4-hour session to share stories and discuss

why we exist as Gift of Grace church, and what the church has meant to us personally, and how Gift of Grace has impacted our separate walks with the Lord. **We have scheduled this to take place on Saturday morning, January 18, 2025. Please put this date on your calendar for January of 2025.

Please pray that this process proves to be helpful and encouraging toward Gift of Grace's future planning as we support one another in our collective witness for the Lord.
