Parting Shot – Becoming well acquainted with the Bible, the Written Word of God is the most reliable way to become familiar with the Good Shepherd's voice. And then you will want to listen carefully to good preaching faithfully based on the Scriptures. This is how Luther explains the 3rd Commandment: Remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy: We are to fear and love God so that we do not neglect His Word and the preaching of it, but regard it as holy and gladly hear and learn it. Otherwise, you become susceptible to the wolves...
