A Lamp Shining In the Darkness

Lead In - Belief in the supernatural and miraculous is essential and indispensable to Christianity. But that having been said, we can overrate the spectacular and easily miss the miracles that seem common and are thereby dismissed or taken for granted...

Parting Shot - A lamp is not as spectacular as the bright sunshine. But in the darkness of night which is our age, a lamp is far more helpful than occasional flashes of lightning! You might say it is more sure! And the lamp is not the flash of lightning on the Mount of Transfiguration. But it is the Word of God that comes to us in Scripture, in preaching, in Baptism, in Confession and Absolution, and in Holy Communion...

Christ's Glory and the Prophetic Word

¹⁶For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷For when he received honor and glory from God the Father, and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased," 18we ourselves heard this very voice borne from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain. ¹⁹And we have something more sure, the prophetic word, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts, 20knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. ²¹For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

Lk 24:44-47 Then he said to them. "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you. that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem.

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
