Parting Shot – So this week as we contemplate and celebrate the great acts of our salvation, including both Good Friday and Easter Sunday, we recognize the greatest gift imaginable is the victory over sin, death, and the devil. And a part of that gift, in fact, a large part of the gift is the distance our Lord has traveled to deliver this gift. It involves the distance all the way to *God-forsakenness*! That's what we see on the Cross where He secured our salvation.
