Lead In — Mark's account, unlike Matthew and Luke's, mentions no particular presentation of a temptation by the devil to our Lord Jesus. We are merely told that Jesus was in the wildemess (read desert) for forty days being tempted by Satan, and that the angels were ministering to Him. And although the other accounts tell of Jesus' overcoming the temptations, we know that such victories were a prelude to the ultimate victory Jesus won over the devil on the Cross. Parting Shot – As the covenant promise to Abraham is renewed the words are spoken again, "that in your seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed." Blessed indeed! The particular offspring spoke on here is the Incarnate Son of God, our Lord Jesus. For He descended from Abraham. When He overcame Satan's temptations in the wilderness, this was a prelude to His final victory over sin, death, and the devil which He won on the Cross. And Abraham's trust in the Lord shows us how we receive the benefits of Christ's benefits – trust in His promise and trust in his atoning sacrifice for sins.
