For judgment I came into this world, that those who do not see may see, and those who see may become blind. -v.39

Lead In – A number of years ago our family visited Mammoth Cave National Park in Kentucky. And as we were led on a tour of one of the winding cave systems, we came to a bit of an opening where we were able to gather in a rock-lined theatre. There, hundreds of feet beneath the surface, we were treated to a sense of total darkness, and the total inability to see...

Parting Shot – We need sleep. But we can become too comfortable in our sleep. And we can be tricked into thinking the only reality is the one of our own dreams and imaginations. And then a loud voice cries, "Rise, and shine! Daylight is burning!" And at the moment getting up is the one thing we may not want to do. But usually, once out of bed and a cup of coffee later... The Gospel Call is crying good and loud, Rise and Shine! And with the daylight of the Son of God and His Word our sight is restored...

Jn 9:2-3 And his disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him. (cf. Ro 8:20-22)

Jn 9:6-7 Having said these things, he spat on the ground and made mud with the saliva. Then he anointed the man's eyes with the mud and said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which means Sent). So he went and washed and came back seeing.

 ${\rm Jn}~9{:}16$ Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for he does not keep the Sabbath."

Mt 5: "You have heard it said ..., but I say to you!"

Mt 12:8 For the Son of Man is lord of the Sabbath. (exceptions made, even in the OT, i.e. David and bread of presence)

Mt 13:9 He who has ears, let him hear.

Mt 13:14-15 Indeed, in their case the prophecy of Isaiah is fulfilled that says: "You will indeed hear but never understand, and you will indeed see but never perceive. For this people's heart has grown dull, and with their ears they can barely hear, and their eyes they

Jesus Heals a Man Born Blind

¹³They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind. ¹⁴Now it was a Sabbath day when Jesus made the mud and opened his eyes. ¹⁵So the Pharisees again asked him how he had received his sight. And he said to them, "He put mud on my eyes, and I washed, and I see."

²⁴So for the second time they called the man who had been blind and said to him, "Give glory to God. We know that this man is a sinner." ²⁵He answered, "Whether he is a sinner I do not know. One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see."

³⁵Jesus heard that they had cast him out, and having found him he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" ³⁶He answered. "And who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" ³⁷Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and it is he who is speaking to you." ³⁸He said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him. ³⁹Jesus said.
