And his life, filled with misfortunes, adventures, and an ironic ending is narrated in Genesis 37 to the end in chapter 50...

Parting Shot – So are we being taught to forgive those who intend evil against us? Yes. But we are promised even more than we are taught! Beautifully, Joseph prefigures Christ. If Joseph's relative innocent suffering could result in good, imagine Our Lord Jesus! Jesus is the only truly, totally innocent sufferer. And indeed the wicked intended great evil against him, falsely condemning him to death on the cross. But of course it is by his death and resurrection that we have been given forgiveness onto life eternal. That is the most important thing to take from this lesson...

¹⁵When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "It may be that Joseph will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him." 16So they sent a message to Joseph, saving, "Your father gave this command before he died. 17'Sav to Joseph, Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because they did evil to you.' And now, please forgive the transgression of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. ¹⁸His brothers also came and fell down before him and said, "Behold, we are your servants." 19But Joseph said to them. "Do not fear, for am I in the place of God? ²⁰As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today. 21So do not fear: I will provide for you and your little ones."
