A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you. - Jn 13:34

Lead In – Jesus knew it was His final night. He knew the next day His hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father. So we can rightly assume, as purposeful as our Lord had always been, that what He did and what said on this night would be intentional and important. It is not that what He said and had done before was not important, but on this night what He did and said was the culmination of everything that had gone before. This is what He would leave His disciples with... Four things...

Parting Shot – And so on His last night before His departure to the Father, Jesus shared a meal with His followers. He instituted a commemorative meal that would serve as the central sacrament of the ongoing life of the Church. He exemplified and stressed the importance of in humility providing loving service. And He left us with a new Commandment. A commandment that could only start to be obeyed by those first loved and forgiven by our Lord Jesus Christ.

Ac 10:41 not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.

Do this for the remembrance of me.

For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

This is my body given for you.

This cup is the new covenant (testament) in my blood <u>shed for you</u> for the forgiveness of sins (Mt) and in (Mk) for many
