Parting Shot – The congregation of God is referred to as the descendants of Abraham. But as the Apostle Paul says in Romans 9, not all who physical descend from Abraham belong to Israel. No, the true Israel is comprised of those who, like Abraham, believe the promises of God, even the promise that God can raise us from the dead. Abraham long ago believed such. And he did so before he had our advantage. For we live after our Incarnate Lord died and rose again and promised that we too would be raised from our graves and share in a resurrection like His! And to the one who believes this, the Lord it will count it as righteousness.

Ge 12:1-3 Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

Ro 4:16 [The promise guaranteed to Abraham's offspring goes] to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist.

Abram = Exalted Father; Abraham = Father of the multitudes

"Behold, you have given me no offspring, and a member of my household will be my heir." ⁴ And behold, the word of the LORD came to him: "This man shall not be your heir; your very own son shall be your heir." ⁵ And he brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven, and number the stars, if you are able to number them."
