Lead In – When our three oldest were young children, our family took a wilderness canoe trip in the Sylvania Wilderness. And it was on the first lake where we were camping that we discovered an unusual sandbar that stretched for hundreds of yards across the middle of the lake. We took some interesting pictures of standing ankle deep in the middle of the lake... But I can assure you, the Sea of Galilee does not have a sandbar crossing the middle of the lake!

Jesus Walks On the Water

When evening came, he was there alone, ²⁴but the boat by this time was a long way from the land, beaten by the waves, for the wind was against them. ²⁵And in the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. ²⁶But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, and said, "It is a ghost!" and they cried out in fear. ²⁷But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid."

²⁸And Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." ²⁹He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. ³⁰But when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, "Lord, save me." ³¹Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" ³²And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. ³³And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."
