Catechism Portion for the Week

The Second Article (Part 1) of the Apostles' Creed – That his followers know his proper identity seemed to matter to Jesus. He once asked, "Who do people say that I am?" And He received many different answers. Popular conceptions at the time involved thinking that Jesus might be John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah, or one of the prophets. But inspired by the Holy Spirit Peter correctly answered Jesus "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." If you asked people today what people thought of Jesus you would get quite a variety of answers. But as Christians we believe, teach, and confess that Jesus is our Lord and that He is both true God and true man.



Portion of the Catechism and Luther's Explanation

The Second Article

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

What does this mean?

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord,

who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all

sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death,

that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.
