The Fifth Petition of the Lord's Prayer: "And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." – In Matthew 18:21-35 we encounter the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant. You may recall that it involves a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. One servant in particular owed a sum way beyond his ability to repay, and so he begged and implored the king to show mercy to him. This king was ready to cancel the debt until he heard of how the servant had failed to show any mercy whatsoever on a fellow servant, and this over a much smaller debt! When we exchange "the peace" each Sunday in our congregation we are highlighting the fact that people cannot live in peace with one another for long unless they forgive one another. As Christians, we pray that for Christ's sake we may know the joy and peace of being forgiven and of forgiving others.
