"He saved us...in virtue of his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal in the Holy Spirit, which he poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life. The saying is sure."







10 READ INTRODUCTION TO PORTION OF CATECHISM FOR THIS WEEK

Holy Baptism the Third Question "How can water do such great things?" - When others accuse Lutherans of making too much of water in the rite of baptism they fail to understand where we put our trust. Our trust is in God's Word! When our Lord chooses to combine His Word with some other element, as He so chooses in Baptism and Holy Communion, then the combination of God's Word with that element becomes powerful. A good account to read is that of Jesus and Nicodemus in John 3. There our Lord Jesus tells Nicodemus that he must be "born from above" (referring to the Spiritual birth) in order to see the kingdom of God. Nicodemus in his fallen nature doesn't have a clue. He takes a stab at what Jesus has said by one possible meaning of what Jesus had just said, that is, that a person must be "born again". He asks how someone can reenter his mother's womb and receive a second birth. Jesus clarifies the matter and states that what he was talking about was being born of the water and the Spirit. He explains further, that to be born of water and the Spirit is to be born of the Spirit. It is our Lord's Word that says this is so. The Apostle Paul will speak of baptism as a washing of the water with the Word (Eph 5:26) and as the washing of regeneration (Tit 3:5). As Christians, we can say, "I am baptized - I am washed - I am God's own child and an heir of heaven. My confidence in these great gifts is based entirely on God's Word and promises."
