#### The Collect for the Week

**Ninth Sunday after Pentecost, Proper 14** Almighty and merciful God, it is by Your grace that we live as Your people who offer acceptable service. Grant that we may walk by faith, and not by sight, in the way that leads to eternal life; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



#### **Catechism Portion for the Week**

The Fourth Commandment Honor your father and your mother. – God gives parents a unique task that serves the well-being of all society. Luther called the Office of Father and Mother the highest in the land. He notes that of the Ten Commandments, God has singled out parents as authorities to be honored. Second only to the fear, love, and trust of God alone, God has commanded that we honor and obey our parents. And as Luther will duly instruct, parents need quite a supporting cast to help them hold society together and raise children in the fear and admonition of the Lord. This supporting cast includes Pastors, Teachers, Governing Authorities, Civic Leaders, Administrators, Law Enforcement Officers, and the like. Interestingly, even as He hung on the cross, Jesus honored His mother as He was dying. And he did so by commending her to the care of His beloved disciple (cf. Jn. 19:25-27). As with all other commandments, Jesus kept the Fourth Commandment! As Christians, we give parents special honor as God's representatives on earth – gifts of God through whom He gave us the gift of life.



## Portion of the Catechism and Luther's Explanation

#### What is the Fourth Commandment?

Honor your father and your mother.

#### What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them.



#### **Prayer Based on the Portion of the Catechism**

**Prayer based on Fourth Commandment -** Heavenly Father, from whom all fatherhood on earth is given: give unto us gratitude for the gifts of parents and others in authority and the humility to serve, obey, love, and cherish them as they fulfill the duties and responsibilities you have assigned to them in this life; through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord.
