2 CONFESS THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father, almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.



10 READ INTRODUCTION TO PORTION OF CATECHISM FOR THIS WEEK

The Second Commandment – When we trust God with all our heart, it automatically follows that we will use our lips to call upon Him as our Creator and Redeemer. We will call upon Him in prayer, praise, and thanksgiving. Otherwise, most uses of His name will be in vain. That is, we will utter or take His name for no good purpose. It would be hard to find a more compelling good and proper use of God's name than the example that the Virgin Mary made as she offered her praise in Luke 1:46-55: "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked on the humble estate of his servant. For behold, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name. And his mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts; he has brought down the mighty from their thrones and exalted those of humble estate; he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent empty away. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, as he spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his offspring forever." As Christians, we treasure and honor God's name with our prayer, praise, thanksgiving, and witness.
