The Apostles' Creed

Blessing before meal





Catechism Portion for the Week

The Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer: "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven" – In contemplating doing the will of God we are reminded of all the obstacles our lord Jesus Himself confronted on His journey to the cross. In Matthew 26:36-46 we witness our Lord praying in the Garden of Gethsemane. You will recall His soul was sorrowful and troubled! Understandably Jesus recoiled at the thought of the suffering that lies ahead, not only physically on the cross, but also with the prospects of bearing the sins of the world. Jesus prayed, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me." And yet He completed the prayer, "Nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will." Thy will be done! As His followers we too encounter many obstacles in bringing the Gospel to the world. As Christians we pray in the Third Petition that God would not allow any obstacle to stand in the way of His gracious will – namely, that His Word and kingdom be extended.



Portion of the Catechism and Luther's Explanation

The Third Petition

Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

What does this mean?

The good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also.

How is God's will done?

God's will is done when He breaks and hinders every evil plan and purpose of the devil, the world, and our sinful nature, which do not want us to hallow God's name or let His kingdom come; and when He strengthens and keeps us firm in His Word and faith until we die.

Prayer Based on the Portion of the Catechism

Prayer based on The Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer - Merciful Father, ruler of all things in heaven and on earth, we acknowledge that Your good and gracious will is done without our prayer. We pray that You would defeat all that opposes Your will: the devil, the world, and our own sinful nature. In Your mercy, we implore You to strengthen and keep us firm in Your Word and faith all the days of our lives and bring us at last the inheritance You have prepared for us in Christ Jesus, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
